# WHO PROVIDES SURVIVOR TASKINGS?

SOS Coordinators are tasked to provide support from several different sources:

- State JFHQ CAC Office
- Installation CAC Offices
- IMCOM G-9
- Casualty & Mortuary Affairs Opns Center
- Other Survivors
- Other Support Coordinators



# Role of SOS Coordinator

- Function as the long term support personnel for Survivors and provide continuation of Army support
- Form support groups, networks, and offer events that will allow surviving Families the opportunity to receive support
- Deliver briefings and outreach to the community and leadership and provide availability of a multitude of resources to the Survivor Families



# Role of SOS Coordinator

- Work with the Family to connect them with appropriate counseling support
- Meet leadership, military agencies and private groups or individuals within the service area in order to maintain a list of community resources
- Assist the Primary Next Of Kin (PNOK) to obtain military records and reports
- Provide information on legislative updates to Surviving Families
- Provide expertise on State and Federal Survivor benefits



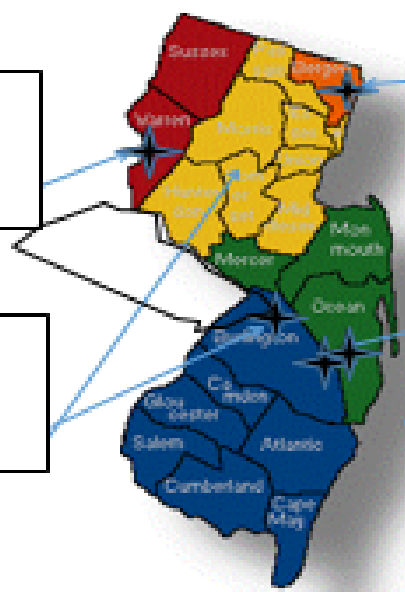
# Important Documents
