Key Details for AGR Retirement Process

- You can start your AGR Retirement process up to 24 months from retirement date.
- If this is a voluntary retirement, a DA 4187 (Voluntary Retirement) is provided to HRO Office no more than 12 months from retirement date. Once we receive the DA 4187 and the retirement date is approved, you can not change the date.
- You must complete the 5 day TAPs Program (Non- Negotiable) and receive a signed DD 2648. The completed DD 2648 is good for 24 months.
- Your retirement process will be completed with HRO –AGR Branch and The Transition Center on JBMDL.
- You must clear all OCIE and update all personnel records.
- HRO-AGR will provide you with a retirement checklist, transitional leave review, DD 214 (whole career), and give you a detailed out-processing brief on what will happen before and after retirement. This will be done by appointment only. Retirement briefs can take up to 2 hours per Soldier. The goal is to help AGR Soldiers feel comfortable transitioning to civilian life. There will be two different appointments for your retirement. The initial brief and final brief. Your spouse is welcome to attend the final brief.
- Any TDG (Non-AGR) who have **20 years of Active Services**, should be seen at the AGR Branch for their retirement needs. Your process will be different, but you will not have to wait to age 60 to received your retirement check.
